The Florida landscape has provided aesthetic inspiration to artists for centuries. Titian Ramsay Peale and John James Audubon came in search of native flora and fauna, followed by Harriet Beecher Stowe, Martin Johnson Heade, George Inness, Winslow Homer, and Henry Ossawa Tanner, who were lured by its natural beauty and warm climate. This presentation offers a succinct and engaging history of Florida's landscape painters.

Keri Watson is Assistant Director of the School of Visual Arts and Design and Associate Professor of Art History at the University of Central Florida. She serves as Co-Executive Editor for Panorama: Journal of the Association of Historians of American Art and is the author of A New Deal for Florida: Parks and Post Offices in the Sunshine State (forthcoming), Visual and Performing Arts Collaborations In Higher Education: Transdisciplinary Practices (2023), This is America: Re-Viewing the Art of the United States (2023), and the editor of the Routledge Companion to Art and Disability (2022). Dr. Watson's research has been recognized and supported by a Fulbright Fellowship and grants from the National Endowment for the Arts, Arts Midwest, the Institute of Museum and Library Services, and the Society for the Preservation of American Modernists.

Happy 85th Anniversary to the Boynton Beach Garden Club!

In 1938, a group of Boynton residents got together to form the **Boynton Beach Garden Club** (BBGC). The Club's first president was **Bertha Daugharty Williams Chadwell** and its initial goal was to encourage home and civic beautification. Eighty-five years later, the BBGC is still "expanding our knowledge of gardening and the floral arts; promoting wise practices to maintain and protect our ecosystem; supporting community projects for the beautification and health of our neighborhoods."

The old Boynton high school, now the Boynton Beach Arts and Cultural Center, located at 125 E. Ocean Ave, was the recipient of one of the Club's first projects: two *Ceiba pentrandra* (kapok) trees. In 2020, the single surviving 55-foot tall, 65-year-old tree was saved from destruction due to the Boynton Beach's Town Square Redevelopment Project. A two-year project, which required the pruning of roots and limbs, required a crane to move the kapok tree across the street from its original location.

Another project of the Club is the maintenance of the butterfly garden at the **Schoolhouse Children's Museum** located at 129 E. Ocean Ave. The dedication and hard work of the Butterfly Garden Committee ensures the success of this beautiful addition to the Museum.

And another garden that the club created and has been caring for since 2017, is the **Community Garden**, located at NW 6th Avenue and Seacrest Blvd. White mayor, **Stephen Grant**, gave the BBGC a grant to create a Community Garden on a vacant plot of land. They also received a grant from the National Garden Club for the Plant America Project. The garden has been maintained with mostly native plants for the past five years. This year, the membership decided to introduce native trees, shrubs, and plants to support bird life in a neighborhood surrounded by asphalt. The plants will provide birds with resting, hiding and nesting places, as well as to provide food in the form of berries, nectar, insects, and caterpillars.

The BBGC meets monthly between September and May. Meetings are a mix of educational programs, hands-on workshops, and group tours or trips. Members are expected to participate in the maintenance of community gardens and activities such as the Boynton Beach Earth Day celebration and the Blue Star Marker memorial event. Changes in Latitude, Changes in Attitude - Jimmy Buffett (1946-2023)

Singer, songwriter, and author, **Jimmy Buffett** was always on the move. He traveled the world in his flip flops singing about the joys of life. One of his stops along A1A was **Nomad Surf Shop**. Jimmy was always enthusiastic about the ocean, fishing, and sailing. He was dedicated to saving the manatees and riding the waves on a long board. He realized that the best part of surfing was paddling out into the ocean and being with his friends. He reminded us that we all need to take time to relax and take time from this stressful world.

Ryan Heavyside, the son of Nomad's founder, **Ron Heavyside**, says Jimmy had a few custom surf boards created for him at Nomad over the years. Walking through the door of the Nomad Surf Shop you will find a photograph of Jimmy on the wall to greet you. There is a true surfing vibe in this family-run business that has been around for over 50 years. Jimmy Buffett was the troubadour nomad. He wrote about surfing in his books and spent decades chasing waves around the world.

It's fascinating to know that even with his devotion to his music, Jimmy took time to enroll at the University of Southern Mississippi in Hattiesburg. In 1969, he graduated with a degree in History. He was a proud supporter of his Alma Mater and honored his mother, Loraine, who was passionate about education, by establishing a scholarship endowment for needy students. College enabled him to meet a diverse group of people and experience different cultures. This would later influence his songwriting.

When I am going down A1A and looking at the ocean on this scenic drive, I am reminded of how much Jimmy Buffett loved A1A. This peaceful drive is something we can all take time to enjoy in this tropical paradise.
