When Newt Perry sank a theater into the edge of Weeki Wachee Springs in 1947, he had no idea his mermaids would become world-famous Florida icons. Tonight's presentation covers the fascinating history of Weeki Wachee Springs told through vintage photographs of the resident mermaids from their earliest days performing silent ballets to their pinnacle of popularity.

Lu Vickers was awarded a National Endowment for the Arts fellowship for fiction as well as two Florida Book Awards and three Florida Individuals Artists Fellowships. In addition to writing *Remembering Paradise Park* with C. Graham, she has written *Breathing Underwater, a novel,* and three other Florida history books: *Weeki Wachee, City of Mermaids, Cypress Gardens, America's Tropical Wonderland, and Weeki Wachee, Thirty Years of Underwater Photography.*

Historical Society Receives Schoolhouse Children's Museum 2023 Spark Award

The Spark Award was presented to the **Boynton Beach Historical Society** at the **Schoolhouse Children's Museum's** Back to School 70's Bash on Friday, September 22, 2023. The award recognizes a business or organization that supports the museum's effort to inspire creativity and the desire to learn through hands-on exploration, play and discovery.

'School Principal' and master of ceremonies for the evening's event, **T.A. Walker**, Executive Producer and Segment Host for Channel 5 WPTV's "Shining a Light." Principal Walker explained, "The award recognizes that this year's Spark Award recipient was instrumental in the founding of the Schoolhouse Children's Museum. The Boynton Beach Historical Society was (and is) a group of individuals who were passionate about their community and motivated to preserve its history and the building whose days as a schoolhouse had ended. More than a few of these individuals had attended the Boynton School themselves or sent their children there...or both. They had fond memories of days gone by, an awareness of the speed at which Florida was growing - and the past receding. As one early Board Member said, 'If we don't do something to preserve our history, our children won't understand the events and concepts that have been so important to our community.' "

Downtown Boynton Beach History Stroll

On Saturday, April 22, 2023, Boynton Beach Historical Society sponsored a narrated, guided walking tour of Ocean Ave, Town Square, and vincinty. The exclusive tour was led by historian **Janet Naughton**. The group of 35 participants, some from as far away as Miami, toured and listened as she shared information about the history of Boynton Beach, historic sites, buildings and homes. Points of interest included the post office, churches, 1926 high school (Boynton Beach Culture and Arts Center), 1913 elementary school (Schoolhouse Children's Museum), City Hall/Library, Centennial Park, The Gables, Charlie Pierce/Barefoot Mailman, Magnuson House, Henry Flagler's East Coast Railroad, Murray House, Capt. Kenny's House, Andrews House (Boynton's oldest house), Ruth Jones Cottage, Oyer block (Hurricane Alley).

Boynton Beach Historical Society Notes with Sadness

Alvin A Lautenschlager passed away in March 2023. Alvin and his lifelong sweetheart, **Sandra Sullivan**, and their family, lived in Boynton Beach and Lake Worth. He was involved in the Civilian Club of Boynton Beach, the *Jubileers*, and supported Sandra's work with the Boynton Woman's Club.

The Society notes the passing of **Bill Winchester** in April 2023. Bill's father operated Flatwoods Plantation, a pineapple farm in Boynton Beach. Bill worked on several area dairy farms and raised cattle. Bill made significant contributions to the Community and was President of the Delray Beach Florida Farm Bureau, member of the Rotary Club and the Masonic Lodge, and with his wife, **Ann Klatt Winchester**, were Life Members of the Boynton Beach Historical Society.

Virginia "Ginny" White Foot, died peacefully in June 2023. Ginny, and her husband, **Robert Foot**, were owners of The Art of Framing, Inc., a cutting-edge community business for 29 years. The studio taught, helped, and allowed customers to frame pieces themselves. Ginny also served as President of the Chamber of Commerce of Boynton Beach, participated in many other Boynton organizations, and together with Robert, were longtime members of the Boynton Beach Historical Society.

Don deLora Reagan, wife of Florida Highwaymen Artist **Willie Reagan**, passed away in July 2023. Don was a passionate supporter of all the Highwaymen artists and of the Highwaymen Museum, in Fort Pierce, FL.

Boynton Beach Receives Historic Marker Poinciana Elementary "Boynton Colored School"

A dedication ceremony for an historic plaque honoring **Julius Rosenwald** was held in Boynton Beach, Florida, on May 12, 2023. The plaque was donated by the **Jewish American Society for Historical Preservation**, with support from the **City of Boynton Beach**, the **City of Boynton Beach Historic Resources Preservation Board**, and the **Boynton Beach Historical Society**. The historic marker is located at the City of Boynton Beach Heritage Park, on the southwest corner of N. Seacrest Blvd. and NW 10th Ave, also known as Martin Luther King, Jr Blvd.

The City of Boynton Beach Historic Resources Preservation Board has recognized the Poinciana Elementary "Boynton Colored School" as a significant part of Boynton Beach history by awarding it an Official Historical Marker. "The plaque illustrates our City's history, increase awareness of the historic preservation program, and promote appreciation and civic pride in our community's history," according to the Historic Resources Preservation Board's website. The two-sided marker has text on one side and images on the reverse.

During the Progressive Era in 1912, philanthropist Julius Rosenwald partnered with African American educator and activist **Booker T. Washington**. They went on to build thousands of schools in 15 Southern states for black students. The schools became known as "Rosenwald Schools" and were frequently the first schools in a black community, helping progress education throughout the South. Jerry Klinger, President of the Jewish American Society for Historical Preservation, explained "Dr. Washington and Mr. Rosenwald had a partnership for good centered on mutual respect and purpose. They both understood that education for all was key to transforming the future."

Janet DeVries Naughton added "The Boynton 'Colored School,' located on the west side of Green Street (now Seacrest Blvd.) and today's NE 12th Ave, was the first Rosenwald funded school in Palm Beach County. In 1925, at the height of Florida's great 1920s land boom, the Rosenwald Fund contributed \$900 in seed money toward a new four-room, three teacher Boynton Colored School. The fund also provided architectural plans and specifications for the schoolhouse."
